Build a habit: small, weekly learning sprints instead of occasional big pushes.



Pilot AI or new tools in low-risk contexts to build your credibility as an innovator.




Ethical Judgment and Trust in an AI Era


Trust is your most important asset, especially when technology is powerful and opaque.

Slide 6 – Political Savvy and Natural Networking


Key message: Understanding the political landscape and building allies is a leadership skill, not a dirty word.

Recognize the formal and informal power structures in your organization.

Build a “natural network”: connect with people around you consistently, not only when you need something.

Practice “nice doggy... until you find a big rock” diplomacy—be pleasant but not naïve.

Story prompt: How political awareness helped you avoid a landmine or get a key initiative approved.



Curious professionals spot opportunities long before they become obvious.

Schedule time to explore new tools, ideas, and fields beyond the urgent to-do list.

Run small experiments instead of waiting for “certainty” or “approval from above.”

Encourage your teams to treat experiments as learning, not as pass/fail tests.
